

2. INCOME AND PRICES

Personal income is estimated by the U.S. Department of Commerce, Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) for counties, states, regions, and the nation. Income is estimated for geographic areas, both as a place of work—wages, salary, and proprietors' income paid there, and as a place of residence—total income of all persons residing there, including dividends, rents, and transfer payments.

“Money income,” another measurement of wealth (or poverty), is reported for counties and cities as per capita amounts, family income and household income. “Money income,” the only measure of income reported for cities, differs from “personal income” in the following respects: money income is measured before the deduction of personal contributions for social insurance and excludes imputed income, lump-sum payments other than those received as part of earnings, income received by quasi-individuals, certain in-kind payments such as Medicaid, Medicare, and food stamps and employer contributions to private welfare and pension funds. “Money income” includes—and “personal income” excludes—income from private pensions and annuities and interpersonal transfers, i.e., child support.

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) measures changes in the cost of living for any specific location over a selected period. This index should not be used to compare one city to another. Although some 27 cities have a specific consumer price index, no index is computed specifically for Tennessee or its cities. The most commonly used measure is the U.S. City Average. Since 1978, data are reported for “All Urban Consumers” (CPI-U) as well as “Wage Earners and Clerical Workers” (CPI-W). The CPI U includes expenditures by urban wage earners and clerical workers, professional, managerial, and technical workers, the self employed, short term workers, the unemployed, retirees and others not in the labor force. The CPI-W includes only expenditures by those in hourly wage earning or clerical jobs.

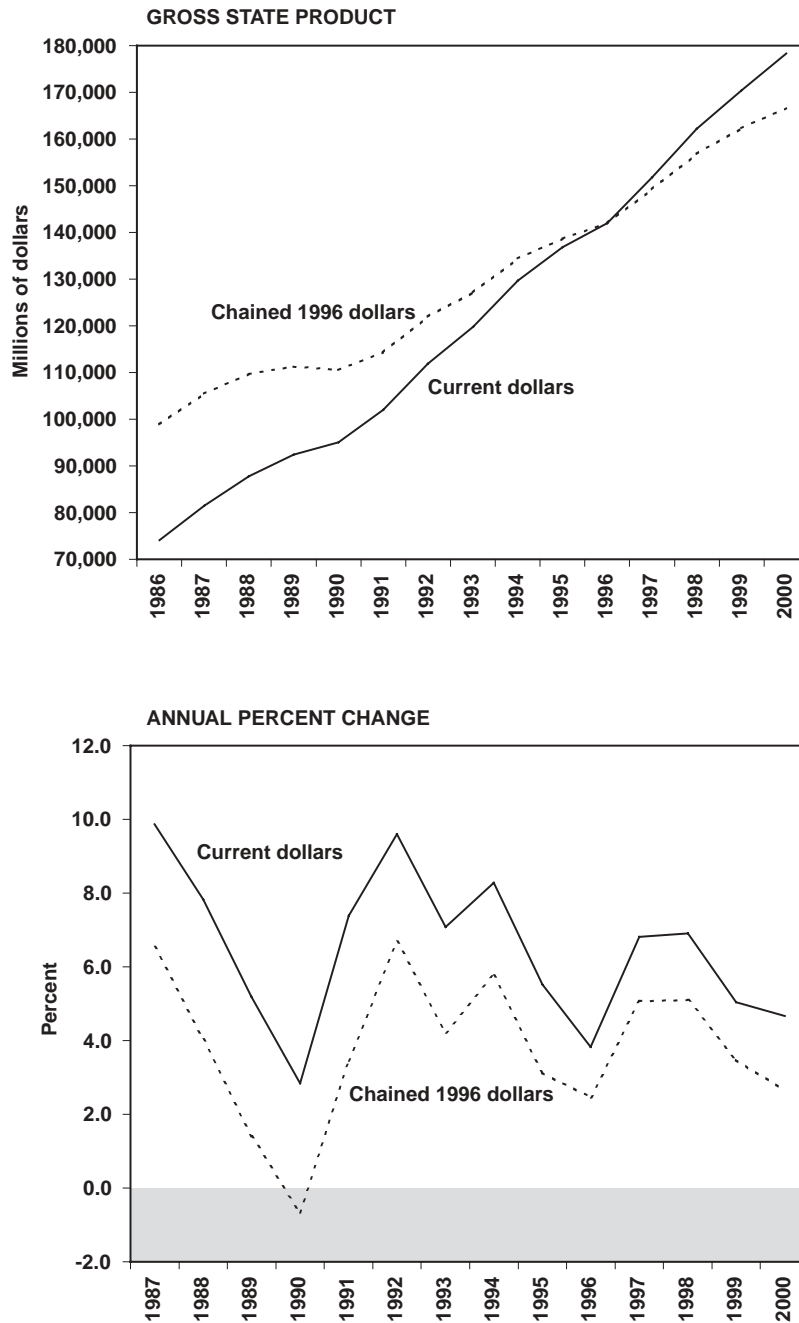

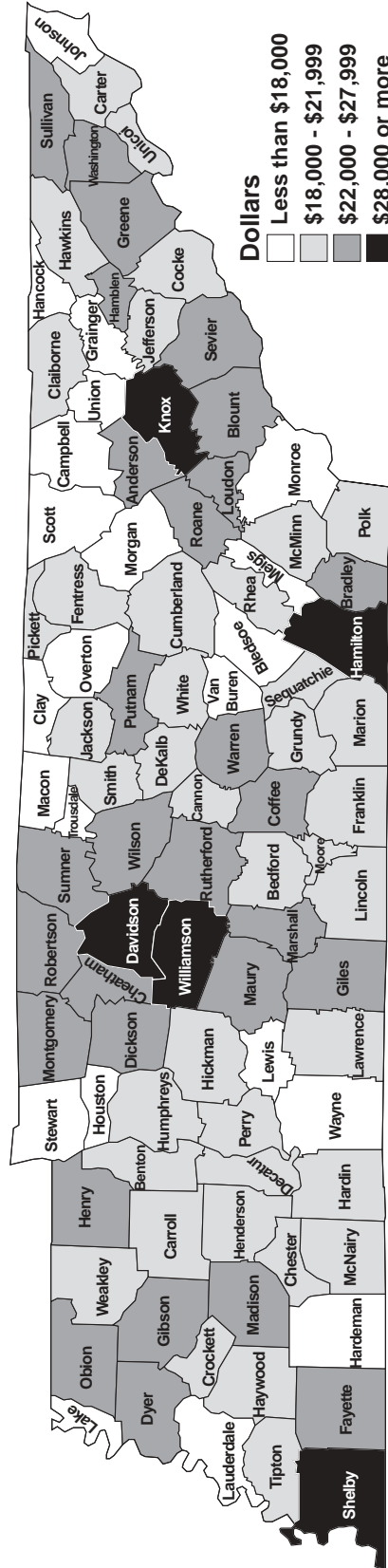

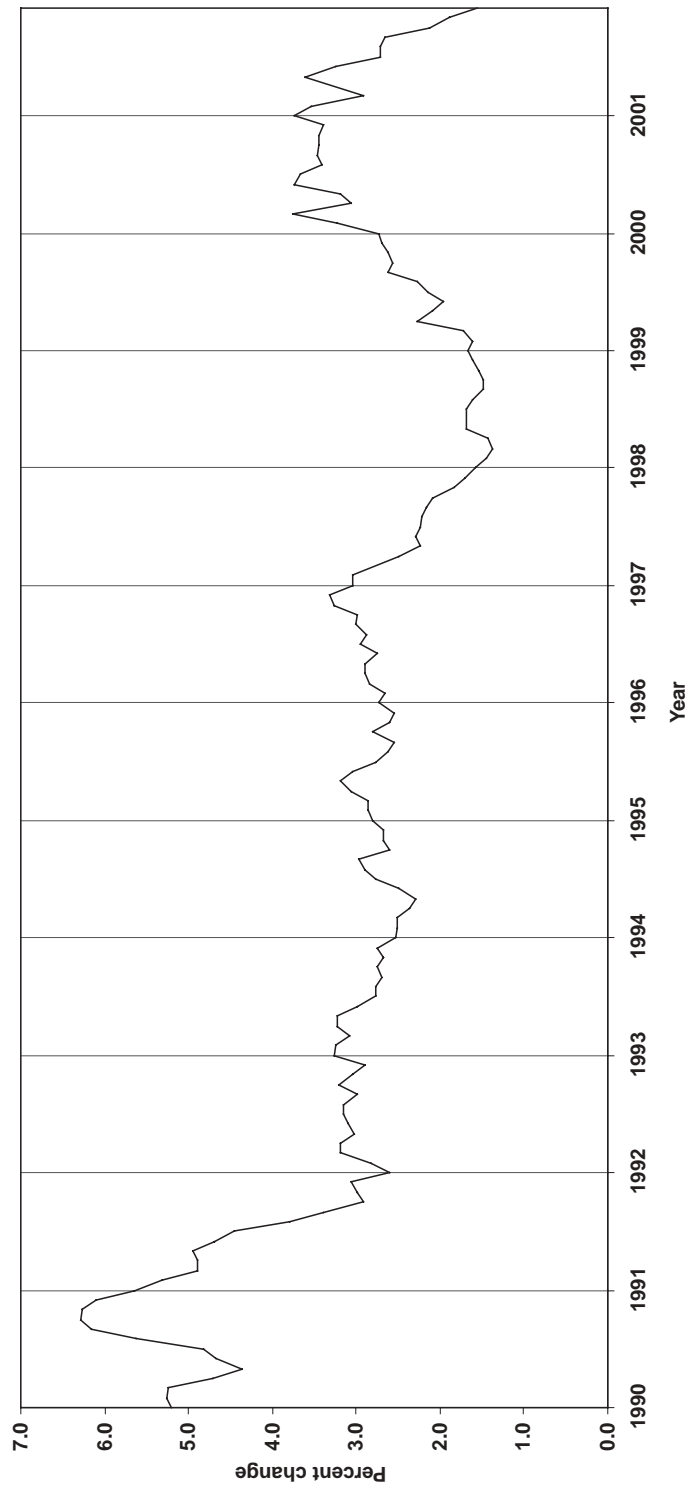
